

# New Chapter School

## Class 9 News

Wow! This year is off to a flying start. First of all, we have loved welcoming back the children after a long break and seeing their smiling faces ready to learn. I have been really impressed with how well they have settled back into the routines and expectations of school life at New Chapter and I couldn't be prouder of them.

We started off the year with our wow day for our Circle of Life topic. Throughout the day, children learnt all about the Maasai

tribe in Africa and underwent some of their daily routines such as spear throwing (using javelins), making colourful jewellery and even building their own mud hut. Some children even challenged themselves to add in a door and reinforce it with art straws. In the afternoon, we looked at African sunsets across the savannah and created a colour wash with animal silhouettes over the top.



In English, we have been building up to writing our own non-chronological reports and conducting research about different animals. This week, we have focussed on giraffes. The children were fascinated to learn that an adult giraffe can be as tall as

18ft compared to a baby around 5ft. We

decided to take the children outside and use chalk to draw lines on the play-

ground showing the height of a baby and adult giraffe and measure everyone in comparison to them. We also learnt that a giraffe eats around 30-35kg of leaves a day. We used a 1kg weight to show the children how heavy this is and how many leaves it would take to make up that weight! Next week, the children will move on to researching their own African



animals to write a non-chronological report of their own.



## Year 6 applications for a secondary school place (September 2021)

It is that time of the year when you should be thinking about which secondary school you wish your Year 6 child to attend from September 2021. Pupils will not automatically get a place allocated at their nearest school, so **every** parent needs to apply for a place no matter which school they are applying for. Some schools are oversubscribed, which means a late application may jeopardise your child's chances of receiving a place and you may then be allocated a place at a school which would not be a preferred choice.

The application window for secondary school applications opened on 1st September 2020 and closes at midnight on **31 October 2020**. Applications must be completed online. **If you do not have access to a computer at home or would like support with this process please contact the Pastoral team.**

## Reading books in Key Stage 1.

Parents and carers of children in year 1 and 2 may have found some of our new reading books in book bags this week (seen in this picture). These are books we are asking children to read to adults, with support where necessary. These will be changed by their phonics teacher on a **Monday** and **Thursday**, providing they can return their current one on the same day. Children are also taking home books from our class book box. A book for pleasure we like to call it. These are books for children to enjoy with a family member, discuss the story and pictures, as well as use as use for the traditional bed time story. Children will be able to swap these more frequently, providing they bring their current ones back. the guaranteed element of Pension Credit

Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop **qualifying** for Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you receive)

## Pirates and Under the Sea

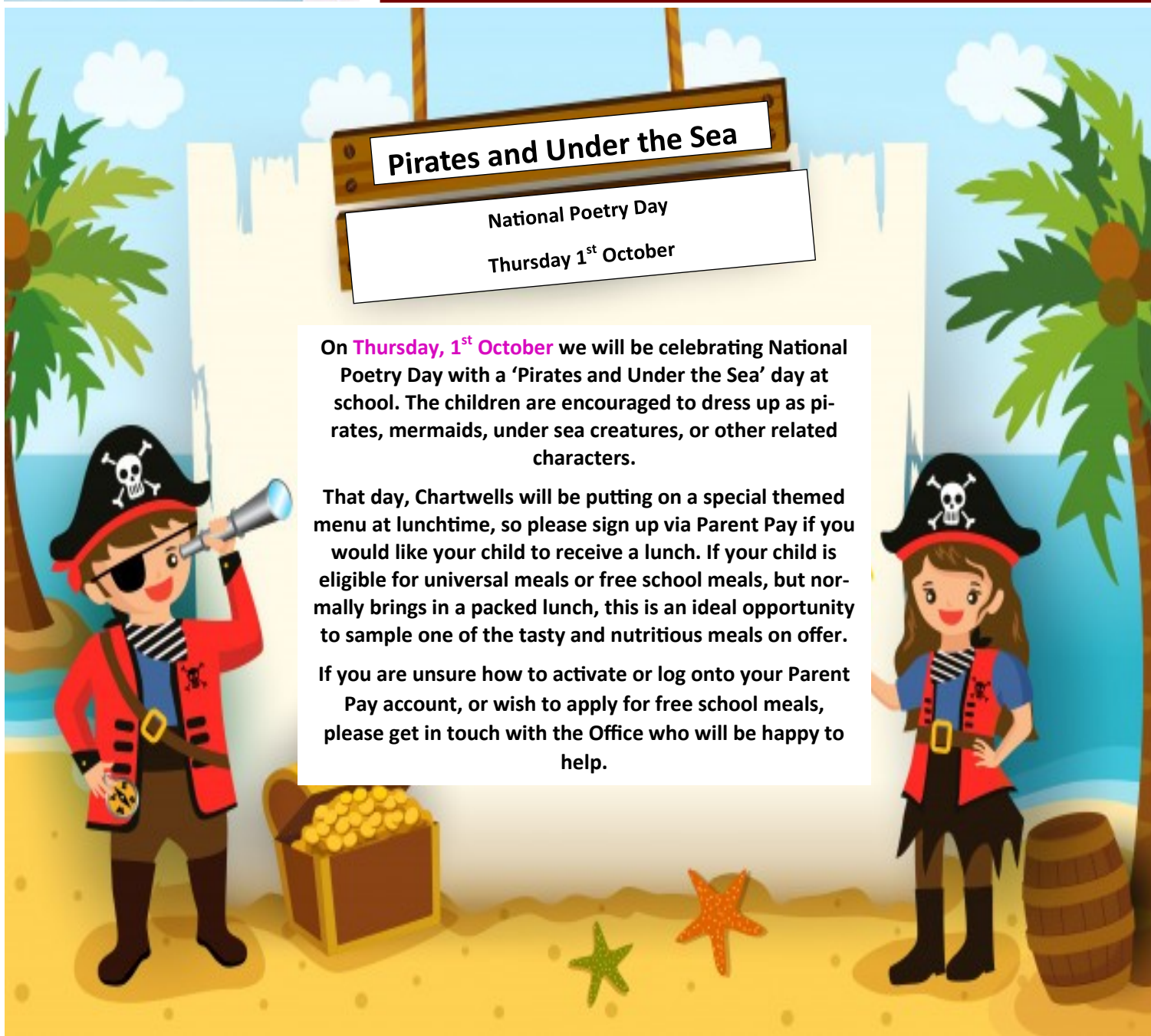
National Poetry Day

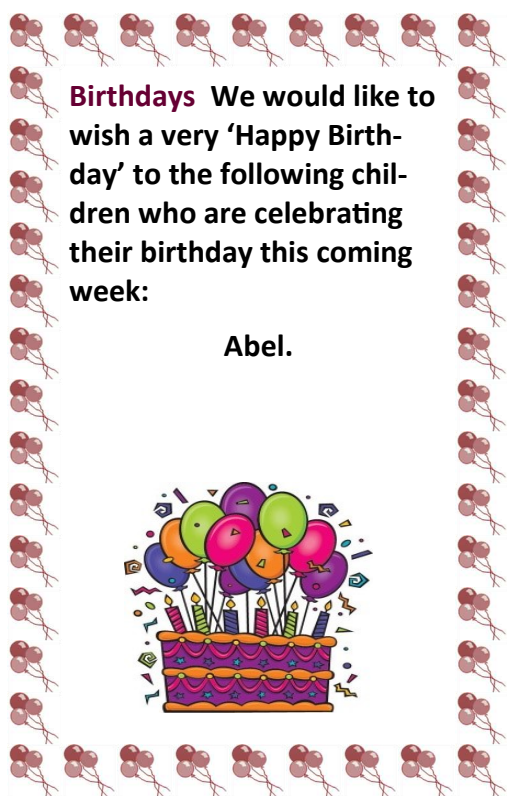
