## Class 4's News



In Class 4 this half term, we have loved our On the Farm topic. On Wow Day we worked with a partner to create tractors in Design Technology using various recycled resources whilst thinking about why recycling materials is important. We have been learning about the different animals, machinery and roles on a farm. In geography, we used this knowledge to design a farm on a map and used a key to show what the different symbols on our maps meant. In computing, we have been learning about algorithms. We have particularly enjoyed creating them on Scratch Junior, Turtle Logo and directing the Beebots.



Acting out stories in English was lots of fun, we used masks to role play being different characters from Farmer Duck and took photos of our freeze frames to order and retell the story in our writing. Our story writing has really improved this half term and we are really impressing Mrs Green and Mrs Styles with our vocabulary and effort! We have been publishing our own farm stories with a problem and a solution. Here is a small section from Ernest's story:

## Breakfast club term 1A September 2021

Breakfast club will recommence for the Autumn term on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September 2021 at 7.30am. There will be 40 places available each day. Parents can book a place half a term in advance by completing a booking form, which was sent out on Monday, or a printed copy can be collected from the school office. Children will not be able to turn up without having a paid booking. For adhoc bookings parents will need to contact the office to see if there are any spaces available. Parents will need to pay for this provision via Parentpay in advance by the previous Wednesday. The cost will be £1.50 per child per day or £7.50 per child for a week.

Doors will open between 7.30am – 7.40am. After this time, all breakfast club staff will be located in the dining room, so we will be unable to accommodate late entries. Children will be given a choice of toast and 3 preserves, milk, juice and water and a selection of cereals and fruits. After breakfast has been served, the children will participate in a set of activities with our PE staff.

## Universal Free School Meals – Year 3

If you have a child that will be moving into Year 3 in **September**, please be aware that they will no longer be entitled to universal free school meals. This does not affect any child who has applied and is eligible for pupil premium free school meals (based on your annual family income).


