


# New Chapter School

## Class 6's News




In Year 3/4, we have been learning about the national treasures of the United Kingdom. We started our journey by exploring the different landmarks mentioned in the story 'The Queen's Handbag' by Steve Antony. In this story, the Queen's handbag is taken by a swan and travels to places like Stonehenge and Giant's Causeway. In groups, we focused on one of these landmarks and created a brochure about it. Many of us were eager to find out more about these incredible places!

In Geography, we compared Great Britain, the United Kingdom and the British Isles as well as developing our understanding of the countries physical features. In History, we have been learning about the Iron Age. We looked at how this time period fits in our British timeline and why it has its name. We have also learnt what life was like in the Iron Age, researching the different jobs people had as well as what it was like to live in a round house. We also explored why Celtic tribes lived on hills called hill forts – do you know why?



Sebby shared, "In England and Wales, wherever you look you can discover ancient giant hill forts. Tribes used these to protect themselves in various ways including being able to see enemies coming." What an interesting time period and we cannot wait to find out more.

In English, we have been exploring Shakespeare. We started with looking at the Macbeth witches' spell poem. The children soon picked up the saying 'double, double, toil and trouble'. The class had a chance to create their very own poem with features including rhyme. They even made them a little gruesome! We have started to explore the full text of Macbeth, debating on who was to blame for King Duncan's death. Was it Macbeth or Lady Macbeth? We are looking forward to innovating the text by creating our very own ending for Shakespeare's Macbeth.
