



# New Chapter School


## Class 5's News



In Class 5, we have loved our new topic, a Knight's Adventure, this half term and have enjoyed expanding our knowledge of all things Middle Ages. In English, we have started our journey to create our own information texts about mythical dragons including what they are, where they live, what they eat and their special abilities. We started this journey by exploring the grounds of New Chapter to capture all of the different dragons Mr

Williams-Morris had accidentally released into the wild. Next, we started to use our imagination to create small fact files for each type of dragon that was found such as lightning dragons that create bursts of lightning when they burp, or ice dragons that fly around the earth refreezing the ice caps. We will soon use all of these skills to create our own mysterious and imaginative dragons for our own information text that we can't wait to share.

Since our trip last week to Warwick Castle, we have explored the different types of castles that have been in the UK over the last 1000 years from the Anglo Saxons to the end of the Middle Ages. We were fascinated with the different features such as the portcullis, arrow slits and the dungeons! We then created different types of castles using our bodies which was incredibly difficult but lots of fun. With great teamwork and perseverance, Class 5 created some quite accurate castles. After this lesson, we dived deeper into castles with a focus on



the jobs within them. We learnt all about the different roles such as jester, gatekeeper and even the gong farmer (not a pleasant job). The children then had to apply for a job to the Lord of Warwick. We had some persuasive applications for each role which would make it incredibly hard to choose just one!

Bez – I want to be a soldier to protect everyone in the castle from our enemies.

Daniela – I want to be a cook as I am always cooking at home for my family with my mum and our food is delicious.

We would like to say a big thank you to all the grown ups who came on trip with us, we couldn't have done it without you. We hope you had as much fun as the children did.





